If you have already filed this application, the decision on your application will be sent under separate cover.</p> <p><b>DEPARTING FROM THE UNITED STATES:</b></p> <p>If you plan to depart the United States you must obtain permission to return to the United States by requesting advance parole before you leave. If you do not obtain advance parole before your departure, you will be considered to have abandoned your application for adjustment of status and the application will be denied. Please see 8 CFR section 245.23(j), for T adjustment of status applications, and 245.24(j), for U adjustment of status applications.</p> <p>In addition, you may be unable to re-enter the United States, or you may be placed in removal proceedings before an Immigration Judge. You may apply for advance parole by submitting an Application for Travel Document (Form I-131) to this office.
